DIY TEENS

Here are a few rooms for inspiration.

A Bedroom for Travellers

Are you bored with¹ your room? How about a little makeover² at the beginning of the new school year? It doesn't cost lots of money, and you don't need a professional designer – you can do it yourself.

DESIGNER BASICS

- Before you start, clean up your room. Look around with fresh eyes and see what you like and don't like about it.
- Throw away or recycle things you don't want to keep.
- Think about new furniture, like a desk with lots of drawers or a bookcase. Every room needs a nice, comfy³ chair where you can relax.
- Choose a new colour for your walls. Try a small sample⁴ of a few different colours in one area to choose your favourite before you start painting.
- Lights are important. Choose a good lamp for your work area.
- Get a pinboard⁵ for your photos, posters and other things you want to see every day.

Start by painting your room light blue. Then take a large map (or whatever size you want) and put it on the wall. You can buy a poster of a map or even wallpaper⁶ of the world. Choose one or two bright colours that are on the map and use them in the room, for example a blue bed cover on your bed. Or you could paint a cupboard or chair yellow, or have green blinds⁷.

A Bedroom for Writers & Musicians

This room has a special wall. It has been painted with black chalkboard paint (= barva k natírání školních tabulí). You can buy this paint from any DIY store. You can write whatever you want on it with white or coloured chalk and change it every day. You can also **hang up**¹ your favourite sports pictures, music posters or even objects like a guitar or a tennis racket. To make sure that the room isn't too dark, choose another bright colour and use it on the other walls and the floor.

A Bedroom for Colour Fans

This bedroom has lots of two bright colours: blue and pink. You can see them in the bed linen (= ložní prádlo), the chair, and the **rug**² on the floor. The walls are painted a bright colour and the doors are white. There are also special wall **stickers**³, which you can put on the wall and easily take off later. Wall stickers or wall art are a cheap way of decorating your room. If you don't have enough money to buy a new chair, you can use an old chair and paint it any colour you want.

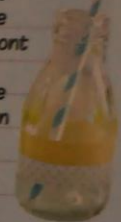


Task 3

MORE IDEAS TO TRY YOURSELF!

- 1 Buy some craft tape (= dekorální pásku) to decorate a pinboard (= nástěnkou).
- 2 Buy some bright coloured paint to change an old lamp into something modern and colourful.
- 3 Take some string¹² and some wooden clothes pegs¹³ and hang your photos or art.
- 4 Decorate your old drawers. If you want to give a new life to old furniture, you can:
 - a) use colourful paint.
 - b) take old magazine covers, old comics, bits of wallpaper or pictures printed from the internet. Put the paper on the front of the drawers, use glue to make it stick, and then paint over with varnish¹⁴.
